In dealing with clients, tax strategy skills in customs-export-import, also the ability as a tax attorney to handle tax lawsuits in tax courts.

Students are also equipped with the practice of tax technology application systems in carrying out tax strategies using analytical data systems and Tax Information Management. By following current technological developments, students can analyse the right strategy equipped with soft skills to be ready to compete towards the intelligent automation era.

The Taxation Program has strong collaboration with various partners, the Directorate General of Taxes, Tax Consulting Firms, and Tax Consultant Associations. The learning method in the program will place more emphasis on tax case-based learning, so students can develop knowledge, skills and analytical thinking. The taxation program prepares students for professional careers in the private sector or corporate and government as Tax Consultants, Tax Auditor, Tax Accountant, Tax Data Analyst, Public Accountant, Tax Attorney, Transfer Pricing Specialist, Digital Tax Specialist, Export Import Tax Specialist, Custom Tax Specialist, HNWI (High-Net-Worth Individual) Tax Planner, International Tax Planner in multinational corporations. The graduates can also continue their studies in a Master's Program (S2) in Indonesia or abroad. In the future, to complete their understanding, they are also encouraged to take tax licenses/certificates of Tax Brevet A, B, and C. Furthermore, they can also become Chartered Tax Professionals and then take a professional certificate such as Certified Tax Consultant (Bersertifikasi Konsultan Pajak-BKP), Certified Tax Practitioner (CTAP) and open their own Tax Consulting Firm. The graduates also can take Chartered Tax Advisor (CTA) certification, Certified International Tax Analyst (CITA), Certified Transfer Pricing (CTP), Advanced Diploma in International Taxation (ADIT) as an international tax planner and Tax Lawyer (CTL) for a professional tax lawyer.
