The taxation program prepares students for professional careers in the private sector or corporate and government as Tax Consultants, Tax Analyst, Tax Attorney, Transfer Pricing Specialist, Digital Tax Specialist/Taxologist, Export Import Specialist, HNWI (High-Net-Worth Individual) Tax Planner and International Tax Planner in multinational corporations.

The graduates can also continue their studies in a Master's Program (S2) in Indonesia or abroad. In the future, to complete their understanding, they are also encouraged to take tax licenses/certificates of Tax Brevet A, B, and C. Furthermore, they can also become Chartered Tax Professionals and then take a professional certificate such as Certified Tax Consultant (Bersertifikasi Konsultan Pajak-BKP), Certified Tax Practitioner (CTAP) and open their own Tax Consulting Firm. The graduates also can take Chartered Tax Advisor (CTA) certification, Certified International Tax Analyst (CITA), Certified Transfer Pricing (CTP), Advanced Diploma in International Taxation (ADIT) as an international tax planner and Tax Lawyer (CTL) for a professional tax lawyer.
